

MIKE WEIR (-5 through 13)

Q. So general thoughts on the round today?

MIKE WEIR: Well, it was a fast and furious start because we know we're at best going to get 36 holes. So kind of did what I wanted to do, accomplished making some birdies and getting off to a good start.

Q. How important was it to kind of sort of get a few birdies?

MIKE WEIR: I think it was very important. You're going to run out of holes, so you want to make some birdies early and kind of keep it going. Made a nice putt on my last hole I played, about an eight, 10-foot putt, so that was a good way to finish.

Q. First time playing the course. What was your --

MIKE WEIR: Yeah, first time since the PGA TOUR days back in the early 2000s. So I think obviously it's a tremendous course, but it's soaking wet out there, so you're just ball in the air. In the pro-am, when the ball was running, it's really fun to play. Like this, it's just throwing darts.

Q. And based on sort of your practice rounds compared to today, how does the mindset change?

MIKE WEIR: Totally different because you're not playing for any runout. you're just trying to get your number right, pick a club to fly it right to the hole.
