ROUND 1 INTERVIEW April 29, 2022

STEVEN ALKER (-5)



Q. Here with Steven Alker, congratulations on your round today. Can you tell us a little bit about it?

STEVEN ALKER: Yeah, I kept my nose clean for most of the day really, just one bogey on the card. I just got hit by the wind on I think it was No. 4 or something, but otherwise, yeah, I just had a lot of chances, I kept it in the fairway and hit some good iron shots. All around I kind of did everything pretty well. A few more putts would have been nice, but nice start. It's always good to get a good start in three days.

Q. With these 54-hole tournaments, you can't really afford any bad round. Everything kind of went well for you today then?

STEVEN ALKER: It did, yeah. As I said, I didn't do too much wrong. Everything was kind of working. A couple more putts would have been nice, but I haven't played with Vijay, so it was nice, good company today. We were just kind of flowing. It was kind of cool, it was neat.

Q. So you didn't throw any shots away?

STEVEN ALKER: No, no, I tried not to. Yeah, as I said, I kept my nose clean and it was a pretty solid round of golf.

Q. How did the weather change from when you teed off to when you finished? Was it much of a difference?

STEVEN ALKER: Yeah, a little bit. It got gusty kind of around the front for a couple holes and then around the back. I hit a couple of iron shots, was like whoa. Especially coming in with the water holes, the carry on 17, you just didn't know what the wind's doing. So just a little bit of a guessing game, but I just tried to play a little long, just take half a club extra and it worked out nice.

Q. You're minus 5, Ernie's minus 6. Is there a score that people have to shoot for to win this thing?

STEVEN ALKER: Hard to say. I mean, the wind's still going to -- looks like it's going to stay up for the next couple days. So it's my first time around this golf course, I'm kind of still getting the feel for it. I can't put a score on it, to be honest; just keep my head down and just keep making birdies.

Q. It's got to feel good though when you have an opening round like this?

STEVEN ALKER: It is, yeah. Normally if you're par or 1 under, you're kind of back in the pack and you start pushing a little bit, but just keep doing what I did today and I should be okay.

Q. Because if you shoot, like if you're even par or 1 over, you know, three-day tournament, you have to shoot lights out for the next two rounds.

STEVEN ALKER: Got some work to do, yes.

Q. You like where you're at then?

STEVEN ALKER: Yeah.

Q. Can you talk a little bit about playing with Vijay? What's that like to play with some of these guys that you watch, right?

STEVEN ALKER: Exactly. A little bit intimidating. I asked Jerry this morning, said I'm playing with Vijay for the first time, is there anything I should kind of do or not do? He said no, he's a big softy, and he was. We had a good chat on the way around. His father actually lives in the same town that I'm from in Hamilton, New Zealand, yeah. We chatted about that a little bit and golf balls and clubs and stuff. Yeah, it was cool, it was fun.
